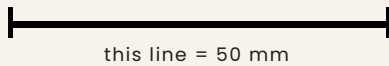

PRINT-AT-HOME BANGLE SIZER

BEFORE YOU BEGIN — CHECK THE SCALE

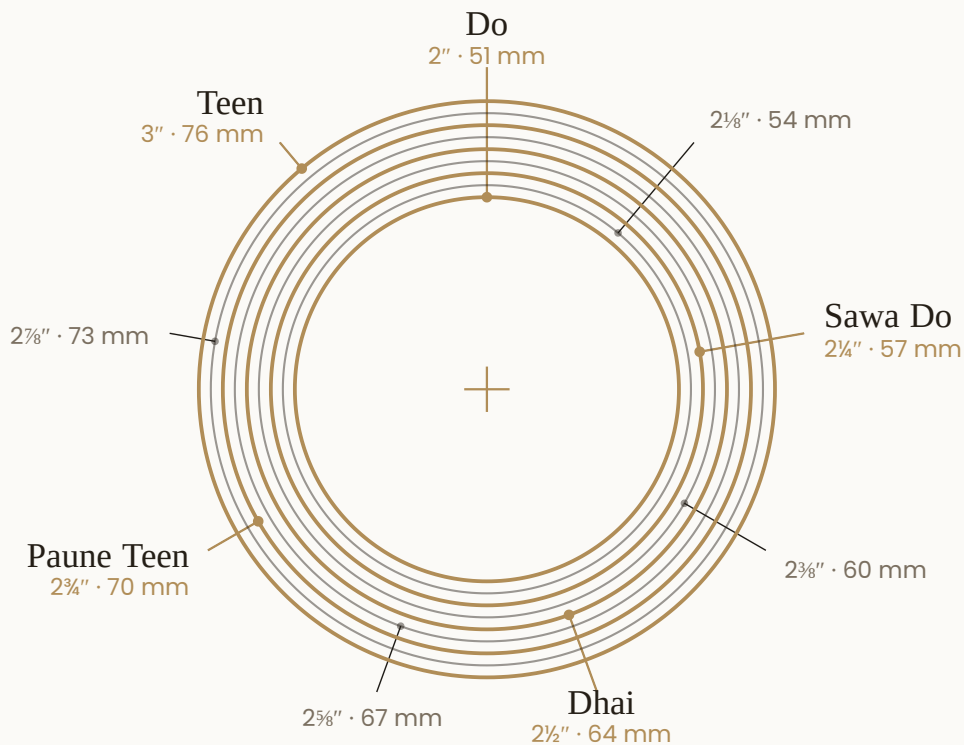
Print this at **Actual Size (100%)**. In the print dialog switch **off** “Fit to page” or “Scale to fit”. Then confirm **both** checks below are exact — if not, the page was scaled and the circles will read wrong.

EDGES SHOULD LINE UP

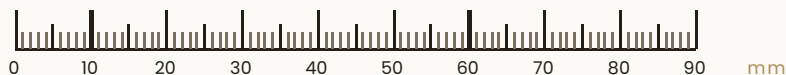
Match a bangle you already own

Lay a bangle that fits comfortably over the rings until its **inside edge** sits on a circle. The **gold** rings are the named sizes. Between two? Take the larger.



Or measure across a bangle

Take a bangle that fits and measure straight across the **inside**, edge to edge, along the rule below. That figure in millimetres is your inside diameter — find it in the table to read your size in inches and soot.



Bangle size conversion

A few notes. A bangle must clear the widest part of the hand, so measure with the thumb tucked in toward the little finger and the hand at its narrowest. Sawa Do (2½") and Dhai (2¾") are the everyday sizes; when between two, the larger slips on more kindly.
